



# perating the Unit on AC Power


Insert one end of the supplied power cord into the AC In Jack and the other end into the 120V wall outlet.

The Power Indicator is illuminated when the power is on.



### perating the Unit on Batteries


play your unit on batteries, the AC power cord must be disconnected from the unit. plug the AC power cord from the unit and insert 8 x "C" size batteries (not supplied) in a compartment.




# hen to Replace the Batteries

place the old batteries with new ones when the sound become unstable or cannot be heard.


1. Set the FUNCTION Selector to the RADIO position.




2. Set the BAND Selector to AM, FM, or FM ST.




- 3. Turn the TUNING control to select a station.


#### To Repeat One Track

- Press the REPEAT Button while the track you want to repeat is playing. The Repeat indicator will flash.
- To repeat another track, press ◄◄ or ►►I.
- · To cancel Repeat play, press REPEAT twice.



#### To Repeat All the Tracks

- Press the REPEAT Button twice during play. The Repeat indicator will illuminate in the Repeat All mode.
- · All the tracks will be repeated continuously.
- · To cancel Repeat play, press REPEAT again.



### rogram Play

u can program up to 16 tracks, in any order you choose.

During STOP mode, press the PROGRAM Button. The Program indicator will flash.




Press ◄ or ▶ to choose a track.

Press the PROGRAM Button to enter the track into memory.

Repeat steps 2 and 3 to program additional tracks, up to 16 tracks can be programmed into memory.


Press Play/Pause ►II. The Program indicator stops flashing, the Play/Pause indicator illuminates and the tracks start playing in the order you selected.




## LISTENING TO A CASSETTE TAPE

We recommend that you use only Type 1 (Normal Bias) cassette tapes only with your tape player.


1. Set the Function Selector to the TAPE (POWER OFF) position.




Press STOP/EJECT to open the tape deck door. Insert a prerecorded tape. Close the door.





















# RECORDING FROM RADIO

This unit is equipped with ALC (Automatic Level Control) circuitry that automatically sets the recording to the optimum level. Adjusting the VOLUME control does not affect the recording.


We recommend that the unit be powered by AC (house current) when recording since this function uses the most power.

We recommend that you use Type 1 (normal bias) cassette tapes only.


1. Set the FUNCTION Selector to the RADIO position.




2. Set the BAND Selector to AM, FM, or FM ST.



- 3. Turn the TUNING Dial to tune in a radio station.
  - In the FM STEREO mode, the Stereo Indicator is illuminated when the FM station is tuned.
  - If unwanted noise is heard in the FM STEREO mode, move the Band Selector to FM (MONO mode) to reduce the noise.




4. Press STOP/EJECT to open the tape deck door. Insert a blank tape, then close the door.




#### RECORDING FROM RADIO

Press PAUSE, then press RECORD. The PLAY key is automatically engaged when using the recording function.




Release the PAUSE button to begin recording.

- If you are recording from the beginning of the cassette, allow 2-3 seconds for the tape leader to pass.
- You can use the PAUSE button to edit any unwanted commercials or programs during your recording.




The recording stops automatically at the end of the tape. Press STOP to manually end the recording.

1. Set the FUNCTION Selector to the CD position.






Press STOP/EJECT to open the tape deck door. Insert a blank tape, then close the door.



4. Press the RECORD Button. The PLAY key is automatically engaged.




Press the PLAY/PAUSE Button on the CD player. The Play/Pause indicator will illuminate.

# eaning the Cabinet

an the cabinet, panel and controls with a soft cloth slightly moistened with plain luke rm water. Do not use any type of abrasive pad, solvents such as benzene, or strong emical cleaners, since these could damage the finish of the unit.

#### **Care and Maintenance**

#### **Handling Compact Discs**


- Handle the disc by its edge.
- · To keep the disc clean do not touch the rainbow colored surface.
- Fingerprints and dust should be carefully wiped off the disc's recorded surface with a soft cloth. Unlike conventional records, compact discs have no grooves to collect dust and microscopic debris, so if you gently wipe the surface with a soft cloth, most particles will be removed. However, small dust particles and light stains will have a minor effect on reproduction quality.
- Wipe in a straight motion from the center to the outside of the disc.

#### **Notes on Compact Discs**


- Never use chemicals such as record sprays, anti-static sprays, benzene or thinner to clean the compact discs. Such chemicals will permanently damage the disc's plastic surface.
- Discs should be returned to their protective cases after use to avoid serious scratches that could cause the laser to skip.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, or high temperatures for extended periods. Prolonged exposure to high temperatures can warp the disc.


#### Notes on Cassette Tapes

 Loose tape may cause trouble. With a pencil or similarly shaped object, gently tighten the tape as shown:



Reseal the slots with adhesive tape to record after the tabs have been broken off.






#### GENERAL INFORMATION

#### eaning the Tape Heads and Tape Path

For continued high performance from your cassette deck, periodically clean the head, pinch roller, and capstan. We recommend cleaning after every 20-30 hours of operation.

To do this properly, press the STOP/EJECT key to open the door and remove any cassette tape still in the Tape Deck Compartment. Make sure that the power is off. Moisten a cotton tip with isopropyl alcohol or a special head cleaning fluid. Carefully rub the face of each head, pinch roller, and capstan with the moistened cotton tip.



#### emagnetizing the tape head

ter 20 hours of use, enough residual magnetism will have built up on the heads to gin to cause loss of high freguency sounds and hiss. At this time, you should magnetize the head and all metal parts in the tape path with a commercially available be head demagnetizer.

#### recautions

Always switch off the unit after use with the Function Selector to the TAPE (POWER OFF) position.

Keep the unit away from magnetic iron, water, or a heat source.

Do not use any chemicals to clean the cabinet. Use a moist soft cloth to clean the cabinet.

Never touch the CD pickup lens. If fingerprints get on the pickup lens, clean it gently with a commercial lens cleaner.
