



Dear Customer:

Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. This manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion-and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

To establish a safe level:

- Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

· Set the dial and leave it there.

Taking a minute to do this now will help to prevent hearing damage or loss in the future. After all, we want you listening for a lifetime.

POWER-CORD CAUTION

Handle the power cord by the plug. Do not pull out the plug by tugging the cord and never touch the power cord when your hands are wet as this could cause a short circuit or an electric shock. Do not place the unit, a piece of furniture, etc., on the power cord, or pinch the cord. Never make a knot in the cord or tie it with other cords. Used wisely, your new sound equipment will provide a lifetime of fun and enjoyment. Another PD-F1007 (301-disc CD changer) can be connected to create a 602-disc changer. Control is possible even with more CDs.

The PD-F1007 is equipped with a single loader that lets you easily play a disc that is not loaded in the rack. What's more, a priority key makes for excellent operability of the jump-in play function.

CD Text compatibility for automatically storing and displaying disc titles

In addition to the title input function, the PD-F1007 is also CD Text compatible. Furthermore, the use of a dot matrix FL makes it easy to manage discs.

Many handy functions for taking maximum advantage of the changer

The PD-F1007 is equipped with three listening modes (ALL, SINGLE and CUSTOM) with ten custom files, as well as a direct button for even greater operability. What's more, a jog dial on the main unit makes it even easier to select discs, input titles and so on.





PUT BATTERIES INTO THE REMOTE CONTROL UNIT



Open the lid of the battery compartment on the rear of the remote control unit, and insert the batteries, taking care to align the \bigoplus and \bigoplus polarities correctly.

Notes!!

- In order to prevent battery leakage, remove the batteries when not using the remote control unit for an extended period (one month or more). If leakage occurs, carefully wipe away any battery fluid inside the compartment, and replace the batteries with new ones.
- Do not allow books or other objects to rest on top of the remote control unit, since the buttons may be depressed, causing faster exhaustion of the batteries.

Incorrect use of batteries may cause leakage or rupture. Always be sure to follow these guidelines:

- A. Always insert batteries into the battery compartment correctly matching the positive ⊕ and negative ⊖ polarities, as shown by the display inside the compartment.
- B. Never mix new and used batteries.
- C. Batteries of the same size may have different voltages, depending on brand. Do not mix different brands of batteries.

CAUTIONS REGARDING HANDLING

Precautions regarding installation

- Placing and using the compact disc player for long periods on heat-generating sources such as amplifiers will affect performance. Avoid placing the player on heat-generating sources.
- Install this compact disc player as far as possible from tuners and TV sets. A compact disc player installed in close proximity to such equipment may cause noise or degradation of the picture.
- Such noise may be particularly noticeable when an indoor antenna is used. In such cases, make use of an outdoor antenna, or turn off power to the compact disc player.
- · Please place this unit on a level surface.



Cleaning the player

To clean the PLAYER, wipe with a soft, dry cloth. For stubborn dirt, wet a soft cloth with a mild detergent solution made by diluting one part detergent to 5 or 6 parts water, wring well, then wipe off the dirt. Also use a dry cloth to wipe the surface dry. Do not use volatile liquids such as benzene and thinner which are harmful to the unit.

Storing discs

- Discs are made of the same kinds of plastic used for conventional analog audio records. Be careful not to allow discs to warp; always store discs in their cases vertically, avoiding locations with high heat or humidity, or extremely low temperatures. Avoid leaving discs in cars, since the seat of a car in direct sunlight can become unbelievably hot.
- Always read and abide by the precautionary notes listed on disc labels.



CD lens cleaner

The player's pickup lens should not become dirty in normal use, but if for some reason it should malfunction due to soiling, consult your nearest PIONEER authorized service center. Lens cleaners for CD players are commercially available, but special care should be exercised in their use since some may cause damage to the lens.

Cleaning and handling compact discs

 The presence of fingerprints or smudges on the surface of the disc will not directly affect the recorded signals, but depending on the degree of contamination, the brightness of the light reflected from the signal surfaces may be reduced, causing degradation of sound quality. Always keep your discs clean by wiping them gently with a soft cloth from the inner edge toward the outer periphery.


- If a disc becomes very dirty, dip a soft cloth in water, and after wringing it out well, wipe the dirt away gently, and then remove any water drops with another soft, dry cloth.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays or anti-static agents on discs.
 Also, never clean discs with benzene, thinner, or other volatile solvents, since damage to the disc surface may result.



With this player, use discs which display the mark shown right. (Optical audio digital discs.)



- When holding discs, do not touch their signal surfaces. Hold by the edges, or by one edge and the center hole.
- Do not affix gummed labels or tape to the label surfaces. Also, do not scratch or damage the label.
- Discs rotate at high speed inside the player. Do not use damaged (cracked or warped) discs.
- Do not play a CD with a special shape (having other shape than a circular disc, such as a heart shaped disc). Otherwise malfunction may occur.
- The CD accessories (stabilizer protection sheet, protection ring, etc.) which are marketed for improving the sound quality or protecting discs as well as the disc cleaner should not be used with this system because they may cause malfunction.




Re-transporting

When transporting this unit in the future, remove all discs from the rack. Turn off the STANDBY/ON switch on the remote control, wait for "OFF" to go out from the display. Also turn the power switch off on the main unit. Then unplug the power cord.


Precautions concerning use of optical fiber cables

- Fully insert the optical fiber cable plugs all the way into the jacks.
- Be careful not to fold or crimp the cable. When coiling an optical fiber cable for storage, make sure the diameter of the coil is 15 cm (5⁻¹⁴/₁₆ in.) or larger.
- Use an optical fiber cable with a length of 3 m (10 ft.) or less.
- Protect the optical fiber cable plugs from scratches and dust.
- When the unit is not connected using an optical fiber cable, be sure to keep the protective dust cap plugged into the optical digital output jack at all times.



CONNECTIONS

Before making or changing the connections, switch off the power and disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet.



A Making connections

- 1 Connect the LINE OUT jacks of this unit to the input jacks (CD or AUX) of the amplifier. Make sure that the white plugs are connected to the left (L) jacks and the red plugs to the right (R) jacks.
- Be sure not to connect this unit to the amplifier's PHONO jacks, as sound will be distorted and normal playback will not be possible.
- 2 Connect the power cord to a household AC wall outlet.
- Make sure plugs are inserted fully into the wall outlet.

Note!

If you connect the power cord to a "SWITCHED" AC outlet on an amplifier, you will not be able to use this unit's memory function.

B Connecting the OPTICAL FIBER CABLE

CD can be played using the digital output.

This unit can be connected to an amplifier equipped with an optical digital jack.

- Remove the protective dust cap from this unit's OPTICAL DIGITAL OUT jack.
- Use an optical fiber cable to connect the OPTICAL DIGITAL OUT jack of this unit to the optical input jack of the amplifier.
- Align the plug of the optical fiber cable with the optical digital jack and fully insert the plug to make a secure connection.

Use a separately sold optical fiber cable for the optical digital jack connections.

© System remote control with a Pioneer stereo amplifier that has the m mark

When a Pioneer stereo amplifier bearing the mark is used, connect the CONTROL IN jack on the rear panel of the CD player to the CONTROL OUT jack of the amplifier. This will enable the CD player to be controlled using the remote control unit supplied with the stereo amplifier. If you do not plan to use this feature, it is not necessary to connect the CONTROL IN/OUT jacks.

- The remote control unit supplied with the amplifier can be used to control Play, Stop, Pause, Track/Disc Search and Disc Change operations.
- For instructions regarding connections and operation, refer to the operating instructions provided with your stereo amplifier.

Notes!!

- When a control cable is connected to the player's CONTROL IN jack, direct control of the player with the remote control unit is not possible. Operate the player with the remote control unit by aiming it at the amplifier.
- Be sure to connect both of the control cable's plugs securely to the CONTROL IN and CONTROL OUT jacks. Do not connect only one end of the cable.
- Be sure to turn off the power of the amplifier before connecting the power cord and output cable.
- When only the digital output is connected, the remote sensor of the amplifier does not function. To operate it, connect the output cable to the stereo amplifier as well as connecting the digital output.

D CD-Deck synchro function

If you have a Pioneer cassette deck provided with the CD-Deck synchro function, connect the **CD-DECK SYNCHRO** jacks of the CD player and cassette deck. With this function, synchro recording can be carried out between the player and deck.

- For details on connections and operation, refer to the operating instructions supplied with the cassette deck.
- The CD-DECK SYNCHRO cable is not supplied with the CD player.
- When CD-Deck synchro recording is carried out on several discs, use the program playback function. (Refer to page 15 and 26 for details of program playback.)

Note!

In order to enable the CD-DECK SYNCHRO recording function, the output cable must be connected to the stereo amplifier.



With these connections, the audio signals are output from one PDF1007 (MASTER unit) to the other PD-F1007 (SLAVE unit), and the CDs loaded in the SLAVE unit are numbered from 301 to 600, so the whole can be operated as a single 602-disc CD changer. Operation is possible from a single remote control unit.

- Use an audio cable to connect the SLAVE LINE IN jack on the MASTER unit (first PD-F1007) to the LINE OUT jack on the SLAVE unit (second PD-F1007).
- 2 Use a control cable to connect the MASTER OUT jack on the MASTER unit (first PD-F1007) to the SLAVE IN jack on the SLAVE unit (second PD-F1007).

Notes:

- Operation of the single loader function on the SLAVE unit can not be done with the MASTER unit or the remote control unit. When operating the SLAVE unit's single loader function, please use the SLAVE unit.
- When connecting 2 PD-F1007 units, connect system remote control and CD-Deck synchro to the MASTER unit only.
- When using 2 connected PD-F1007 units, make sure that the power of both units is ON.
- When not connecting a SLAVE unit, be sure to unplug the cable.

Notes when 2 PD-F1007 units are connected

For usage

- · Always turn the power of both units on.
- · Make Optical digital out connection to both the master unit and slave unit.
- Make CONTROL IN/OUT jack and CD-DECK SYNCHRO connection to the MASTER unit.

For the remote control unit

- SLAVE unit single loader slot operation can not be done with the remote control unit. Operate using the SLAVE unit.
- The remote control's DISC (-/+), ◄
 , ▶► , ▶► , ▶► , ▶► , ▶► , ▶► , ▶► buttons will function for the corresponding unit that is operating.

For operation

- Operation of a program spanning 2 connected units is not possible.
- When 2 units are connected, disc numbers will be from 1 to 300 on the MASTER unit and from 301 to 600 on the SLAVE unit. Custom file numbers will be from 1 to 10 on the MASTER unit and from 11 to 20 on the SLAVE unit.
- Relay playback (Playback continues on the SLAVE unit after playback has finished on the MASTER unit)



■ REMOTE CONTROL OPERATIONS



When operating the remote control unit, point the unit's infrared signal transmitter at the remote control receiver (Remote Sensor) on the front panel of the player. The remote control unit can be used within a range of about 7 meters (23 feet) from the remote sensor, and within angles of up to about 30 degrees.

Notes!!

- If the remote control sensor window is in a position where it receives strong light such as sunlight or fluorescent light, control may not be possible.
- When another PD-F1007 (SLAVE) is connected to create a 602disc changer, only the remote sensor on the first PD-F1007 (MASTER) will work.



HOW TO LOAD THE DISCS (Be sure to read this before operation)

Loading discs into the rack

- You can load up to 300 discs in the rack. The numbers marked on the rack are used as the disc numbers. These are marked in a clockwise order from 1 to 300.
- The following procedure describes how to load discs from disc No. 1.



Turn power ON.

When the STANDBY indicator is not lit

Press the POWER swich on the main unit.

When the STANDBY indicator

Press the STANDBY/ON swich on the remote control unit.



Ensure that the disc No. shown on the display is "1".

If disc number "1" is not displayed, press digit button 1 on the remote control unit. (Carry out step 3 within 5 seconds.)




Press UNLOAD.



The hood will open.

When UNLOAD is pressed, the hood opens to the disc corresponding to the disc No. displayed on the front of the unit.



Load the disc into the rack with the label side (printed surface) facing to the right.

Label side faces right. (Side to be played faces left.)

Note!!

Inserting more than one disc into the slot will damage the discs and cause the unit to malfunction.



Turn the jog dial clockwise to rotate the rack.

When the jog dial is turned clockwise, the rack turns in the direction in which the disc number increases (1, 2, 3 ...).

When turned clockwise, the rack turns in the opposite direction.



Load other discs into the rack by repeating steps 4 and 5 for each of them.





Press OPEN/CLOSE.

The hood will close.

When the hood closes, the rack is revolved once for disc detection (disc loaded/not loaded detection

Difference between OPEN/CLOSE and UNLOAD

OPEN/CLOSE: The hood is simply opened or closed.

UNLOAD: The slot corresponding to the disc No. being displayed rotates to the center position then the hood is opened.

- Do not attempt to open the hood with your hand.
- Be careful not to pinch your fingers when opening and closing the hood.
- If PLAY operation (PLAY, BEST, Hi-LITE, PREVIOUS) is carried out before disc detection finishes, PLAY operation will proceeded to without detection. In this case, detection will operate after PLAY is finished. Detection may not function properly depending on the color or shape etc., of the disc.



WARNING:

Do not put your hand or any other object inside the rack, otherwise injury or part damage may



- While changing or inserting discs, be careful not to press any buttons on the main unit or the remote control. The rack may move suddenly, and then your fingers may be caught between discs and the side of door.
- When changing or inserting discs, make sure the rack is stopped. Do not attempt to put a disc in when the rack is moving.
- Do not put anything other than CDs inside the rack.
- Load only one disc into each disc slot.
- Do not apply force to the rack. This can cause a malfunction.
- 8-cm (3-in.) discs cannot be played as they are. First attach the 8cm (3-in.) disc adapter to each 8-cm (3-in.) disc and load them together in the player.
- Never start playback by placing the 8-cm (3-in.) disc adapter alone, without attaching it to a disc.
- The unit will not operate if the hood is opened during playback. Be sure to close the hood before attempting any operation.
- To load or remove a disc in or from the slot which is seen through the hood, press OPEN/CLOSE. The hood is opened, "HOLD" is displayed and the disc can be loaded in or ejected from the slot seen through the hood. Even while "HOLD" is being displayed, the rack can be rotated by pressing DISC (-/+).

To remove the discs...



1 Press UNLOAD.



2 Select the number of the disc you want to unload by turning the jog dial or pressing DISC (-/+) on the remote control unit.


Playing a disc that is not loaded in the rack

Use the single loader slot to play discs that are not loaded in the rack .

- If a disc has been loaded in the Single Loader slot, pressing SINGLE LOADER PLAY allows you to play it anytime, even during playback of a disc stored in the rack.
- To play the disc in the Single Loader slot using the remote control unit, press "0" and DISC SET.
- When another PD-F1007 is connected to create a 602-disc changer, the CDs loaded in the SLAVE unit (second PD-F1007) are numbered from 301 to 600.

When using the SLAVE unit's single loader slot, operate using the buttons on the SLAVE unit itself.

Opening or closing the hood during playback.



To open the hood during playback
Press the OPEN/CLOSE button and hold it in for about 2 seconds.

To program and play only the discs you want to hear (CUSTOM play)


This unit lets you program up to 300 of your favorite discs. For example, you can store all the discs of your favorite artist, or some other group of personal selections, and play only those discs. You can even add other discs to the custom later on.

Also, there are ten programmable custom files in which you can program any discs you like.

Operation example: Programming discs 3 and 12 in custom file 5



In the stop mode, press the mode button several times to set the custom mode.



Select the custom number with the remote control unit's digit buttons.



- If some disc number appears, press CLEAR.
 - To perform this operation on the main unit, Press direct custom



Checking the numbers of the stored discs.

Remote control unit operation.

Press **DISC(-/+)**. Each time you press **DISC(-/+)**, a disc number stored in the CUSTOM file is displayed. When all the disc numbers have been displayed, the disc number changes to a blank. (To perform this operation on the main unit, turn the jog dial clockwise.)




Pressing the front panel's CLEAR button during the custom mode will cancel the displayed disc number from the custom file.

- When the jog dial is used during custom playback, only the discs stored in the custom file can be selected.
- If you use the digit buttons and DISC SET on the remote control during CUSTOM playback to choose a disc not stored in the CUSTOM file, "NO DISC" will be displayed for approximately 3 seconds.
- When a disc appointed to the CUSTOM file is not loaded in the rack, "NO DISC" is displayed for approximately 3 seconds, the disc is erased from memory, and CUSTOM searches for the next disc.
- The discs stored in the CUSTOM file will not be erased when you turn off the power.
- Memorized data will be stored in memory for approx. 1 month even if the power cord is unplugged or the main unit's power is turned OFF. However, this period may be shortened somewhat, depending on the amount of memory used.


(Memory Back-Up Function).

When another PD-F1007 is connected to create a 602-disc changer, 20 custom files can be programmed. Note however that only discs loaded in the first PD-F1007 can be programmed in custom files 1 to 10, and only discs loaded in the second PD-F1007 can be programmed in custom files 11 to 20.





- · The operation is available only from the remote control unit.
- These operations can not be performed on the CD inserted into the SINGLE LOADER SLOT.



To store your favorite tracks (BEST play)

To use the one-touch memory, just press the BEST button while playing a track you like. You can store up to 50 tracks.



Press BEST while playing a track you like.

The BEST indicator blinks and the disc and track number are stored in memory.



<To listen to the memorized tracks>



Press BEST during stop mode.

The BEST indicator lights and playback starts from the most recently memorized track.

- If you press CLEAR during Best playback, the current track is erased and the next track starts to play.
- When two units are connected, use the CLEAR button on the slave unit to erase the current track on the slave unit.
- You cannot memorize a track twice by pressing BEST during Best playback.
- If you press BEST to memorize a track when 50 tracks are already memorized, the oldest track is erased from memory and the new track is memorized.
- The memorized contents are stored, even when the power is turned off.
- Memorized data will be stored in memory for approx. 1 month even if the power cord is unplugged or the main unit's power is turned OFF. However, this period may be shortened somewhat, depending on the amount of memory used.

(Memory Back-Up Function).

To find out which discs you've listened to recently (PREVIOUS scan)

- This function scans the discs in reverse order, starting from the last disc you played.
- It can remember up to 20 discs. If the total number of discs exceeds 20, the oldest disc will be erased to make room for the new disc.

Example: If you played discs 1, 2, 9, 12 and 13 in order.



Press the PREVIOUS but-

The unit plays a 10 second portion located one minute into the first track of each disc, starting from the last disc you played: 13, 12, 9, 2, 1:





Press ► (►/II) when you reach the disc you want to hear.

 Previous disc scan is canceled and normal play resumes.



- To cancel the scanning, press ■.
- Discs played during random, program, HI-LITE scan, Best and Single Loader playback are not included in the PREVIOUS scan.
- If the first track is less than 1 minute long, the first 10 seconds of the track the beginning will be played. If the first track is less than 10 seconds long, the entire track will be played.
- Memorized data will be stored in memory for approx. 1 month even if the power cord is unplugged or the main unit's power is turned OFF. However, this period may be shortened somewhat, depending on the amount of memory used.

(Memory Back-Up Function).



To playback tracks/discs at random (RANDOM play)

RANDOM selects tracks at random from the disc(s) in the current play mode and plays each track once. The selected play mode stops after its contents are played back. (Refer to chart below.)

SINGLE	Plays all the tracks from a single disc at random.



- Random play cannot be activated during the program mode. (If you

- If you press MODE during random play, random play is switched to the ALL or SINGLE play.

- When the all random mode is set while another PD-F1007 is connected to create a 602-disc changer, the discs on the first PD-F1007 are first played in random order, then the discs on the second PD-F1007 are played in random order.
- If disc detection has not finished, random play will begin after it has detection has finished.



To program tracks/discs in a desired order (PROGRAM play)

- The remote control is the most convenient way to perform these operations.
- You can program up to 36 steps.
- The same operation is possible by pressing the button indicated between parentheses.

Operation example: Programming disc 2, track 7 as step 1, and disc 5, track 3 as step 2.







- The following restrictions apply to programming when 2 PD-F1007 units are connected.
 - · When inputting program data with the remote control unit, when the 1st disc number is P0 or between 1 and 300, program input will be on the MASTER unit. When between 301-600, program input will be on the SLAVE unit.
 - · Carry out programming of the SLAVE unit's PO using the controls on the SLAVE unit.
 - · When programs are input on both the MASTER unit and SLAVE unit, program playback will start from the unit that PLAY is pressed on. After playback has finished, pressing PLAY on the other unit will start playback on that unit. (RELAY PROGRAM play is not possible.)

- For discs equipped with CD Text, the first 12 characters of the disc title are automatically stored in the memory, and the 12-character title is displayed each time that disc is selected.
- To give your own title to a disc equipped with CD Text, input a space at the first character, then start the your title from the second character.
 - Once this is done, the title will no longer switch automatically when that disc is selected.
- When inputting titles with the SLAVE unit, use only the TITLE/ INPUT button on either the unit itself, or the remote control unit.

- Disc titles cannot be given to discs in the single loader slot.
- Disc titles cannot be given to discs equipped with CD Text during playback. Press the stop button to set the stop mode before doing so.

VARIOUS OPERATIONS



Input title of CUSTOM groups

During the custom mode, custom titles can be input by pressing the TITLE/INPUT button. Refer to "Disc Title Input" for the input method.

Custom group titles are displayed when the custom mode is set and when custom playback is started.

Correcting a title that has already been input

Titles that have already been input can be corrected (characters can be cleared or added).

Clearing a character input by accident





TROUBLESHOOTING

Incorrect operations are often mistaken for trouble and malfunctions. If you think that there is something wrong with this component, check the points below. 


Displaying titles or artist's name

For discs equipped with CD Text

When playback starts, the track title is displayed. After several seconds, the display starts scrolling.

Display can be switched as shown below by pressing the TITLE/ DISPLAY button.



- Some CD TEXT data does not include "Artist's name".
- When scroll display of Track title, Disc title and Name of artist has finished, the display will return to Track

For discs not equipped with CD Text

If the title input function has been used to input a disc title and artist's name, the display switches as shown below each time the TITLE/ DISPLAY button is pressed.



Finding the desired CD by the disc title or artist's name

Searching by using the disc title is called "title search", and searching by using the artist's name is called "artist search".


