### Wiring the Main Power Supply Plug (UK Only)

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

The main lead on this equipment is supplied with a moulded plug incorporating a fuse. The value of the fuse is indicated on the pin face of the plug and if it requires replacing, a fuse approved to BS1362 of the same rating must be used.

Never use the plug with the fuse cover removed. If the cover is detachable and a replacement is required, it must be of the same colour as the fuse fitted in the plug. Replacement covers are available from your dealer.

If the fitted plug is not suitable for the power points in your house or the cable is not long enough to reach a power point, you should obtain a suitable safety approved extension lead or consult your dealer for assistance.

However, if there is no alternative to cutting off the plug, remove the fuse and then safely dispose of the plug. Do not connect the plug to a main socket as there is a risk of shock hazard from the bared flexible cord.

Never attempt to insert bare wires directly into a main socket. A plug and fuse must be used at all times.

### IMPORTANT

The wires in the main lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:- BLUE = NEUTRAL

BROWN = LIVE

As these colours may not correspond to the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:-

The wire coloured BLUE must be connected to the terminal marked with the letter N or coloured BLUE or BLACK.

The wire coloured BROWN must be connected to the terminal marked with the letter L or coloured BROWN or RED.

## WARNING : DO NOT CONNECT EITHER WIRE TO THE EARTH TERMINAL WHICH IS MARKED WITH THE LETTER E OR BY THE EARTH SYMBOL \_\_\_\_\_, OR COLOURED GREEN OR GREEN AND YELLOW.

### Precautions

- Ensure that the AC power supply in your house complies with the identification sticker located on the back of your product.
- Install your product horizontally, on a suitable base (furniture), with enough space around it for ventilation (7.5~10cm).
- Do not place the product on amplifiers or other equipment which may become hot. Make sure the ventilation slots are not covered.
- Do not stack anything on top of the product.
- Before moving the product, ensure the Disc Insert Hole is empty.
- In order to disconnect the product completely from the power supply, remove the AC plug from the wall outlet, especially when left unused for a long period of time.
- During thunderstorms, disconnect the AC plug from the wall outlet. Voltage peaks due to lightning could damage the product.
- Do not expose the product to direct sunlight or other heat sources. This could lead to overheating and malfunction of the product.
- Protect the product from moisture, and excess heat or equipment creating strong magnetic or electric fields (i.e. speakers.).
- Disconnect the power cable from the AC supply if the product malfunctions. Your product is not intended for industrial use.
- Use of this product is for personal use only.
- Condensation may occur if your product or disc has been stored in cold temperatures. If transporting the product during the winter, wait approximately 2 hours until the product has reached room temperature before using.
- The batteries used with this product contain chemicals that are harmful to the environment. Do not dispose of batteries in the general household trash.
- Maintain an open space of approximately 6 inches (15 cm) on the sides and rear of the system, for ventilation purposes.
- Place the speakers at a reasonable distance on either side of the system to ensure good stereo sound.
- Direct the speakers towards the listening area.

### Cautions on Handling and Storing Discs

Small scratches on the disc may reduce sound and picture quality or cause skipping.

Be especially careful not to scratch discs when handling them.

### Holding discs

- Do not touch the playback side of the disc.
- Hold the disc by the edges so that fingerprints will not get on the surface.
- Do not stick paper or tape on the disc.

### Disc Storage

- Do not keep in direct sunlight.
- Keep in a cool ventilated area.
- Keep in a clean Protection jacket. Store vertically.
- Do not allow the discs to become contaminated with dirt.
- Do not load cracked or scratched discs.

### Handling and Storing Discs

If you get fingerprints or dirt on the disc, clean it with a mild detergent diluted in water and wipe with a soft cloth.

- When cleaning, wipe gently from the inside to the outside of the disc.
- Condensation may form if warm air comes into contact with cold parts inside the product. When condensation forms inside the product, it may not operate correctly. If this occurs, remove the disc and let the product stand for 1 or 2 hours with the power on.

### Disc Types And Disc Format

This product does not support Secure (DRM) Media files.

### CD-R Discs

- Some CD-R discs may not be playable depending on the disc recording device (CD-Recorder or PC) and the condition of the disc.
- Use a 650MB/74 minute CD-R disc.
- Do not use CD-R discs over 700MB/80 minutes as they may not be played back.
- Some CD-RW (Rewritable) media, may not be playable.
- Only CD-Rs that are properly "closed" can be fully played. If the session is closed but the disc is left open, you may not be able to fully play the disc.

### CD-R MP3 Discs

- Only CD-R discs with MP3 files in ISO 9660 or Joliet format can be played.
- MP3 file names should contain no blank spaces or special characters (. = +).
- Use discs recorded with a compression/decompression data rate greater than 128Kbps.
- Only files with the ".mp3" and ".MP3" extensions can be played.
- Only a consecutively written multisession disc can be played. If there is a blank segment in the Multisession disc, the disc can be played only up to the blank segment.
- If the disc is not closed, it will take longer to begin playback and not all of the recorded files may be played.
- For files encoded in Variable Bit Rate (VBR) format, i.e. files encoded in both low bit rate and high bit rate (e.g., 32Kbps ~ 320Kbps), the sound may skip during playback.
- A maximum of 999 tracks can be played per CD.


### **Remote Control**



\* This product may not have the RDS function depending on your region.

### Installing batteries in the Remote Control

- Place batteries in the remote control so they match the polarity : (+) to (+) and (-) to (-).
- Always replace both batteries at the same time.
- Do not expose the batteries to heat or a flame.
- The remote control can be used up to approximately 23 feet (7 meters) in a straight line.



### CD/MP3/WMA-CD Playback

You can play 12 cm compact disc without an adapter.

This product is designed to play an audio CD, CD,CD-R,CD-RW,MP3/WMA-CD.

- Gently open or close the CD tray and do not apply excessive force.
- Do not put force or place a heavy object on the product.
- Do not insert an out-of-spec. shape of CD such as a heart or octangle shaped CD. Otherwise, the product may be damaged.
- Care must be taken about maintenance of the compact discs.
- 1. Press OPEN/CLOSE button to open the disc tray.
- 2. Place a disc gently into the tray with the disc label faces upward.
- 3. Press **OPEN/CLOSE** button to close the disc tray,the disc will be played automatically.
  - For MP3/WMA-CD audio, it may take several minutes to complete scanning the disc tracks.
  - If you play a file with an English name or a MP3/WMA-CD medium in an English title, the song title will be shown in the display.(Other languages besides English may not be indicated.)
  - An English-titled track containing a special character will not show the title in the display.

#### <CD/MP3/WMA-CD PlaybackDisplay>

- Adjust the volume according to needs with the following procedures.Press the VOLUME button of the main unit or Press the VOLUME+or –button of the remote control. The volume level can be adjust in 31 steps (VOL MIN,VOL 1- VOL 29,andVOL MAX).
- To pause playback temporarily, press the PLAY/ PAUSE (►II) button
  - Press **PLAY/PAUSE** (►II) again to resume playing.
- 6. To end playing, press STOP (■).

- If there is not one CD inserted in the disc tray, it is indicated as "NO DISC".
  - The quality of MP3/WMA-CD playback may vary depending on the condition of the disc containing the music files or the condition of the recorder with which the disc was created.
  - If different types of files or unnecessary folders are on the same disc, you will have problems with playback.
  - Keep the tray closed whenever you are not using it, to prevent dust from entering.
  - You can load or unload compact disc when the radio, usb or auxiliary source function is selected, and when you press the Open/ Close button, all of the other functions will be changed to MP3/CD mode.
  - If no buttons are pressed on the product or remote control for more than 3 minutes when the product is in Pause mode, it will be changed to stop mode.
  - If no buttons are pressed on the product or remote control for more than 25 minutes when the product is in no Disc or Stop mode, the power will automatically turn off.

### Selecting a Track

You can select a desired track while the disc is being played.

#### To play the previous track

- -Press the I button within 3 seconds after the current track started playing.
- Press the I button twice at least 3 seconds after the current track started playing.

#### To play the next track

#### - Press the ▶ button.

#### -----

#### To play the current track

- Press the I button 3 seconds later after the current track started playing.

### To play the track of your choice

### Repeating One or All Tracks on the Compact Discs

You can repeat playing CD indefinitely.

- CD containing a specific track.
- Whole tracks of a selected CD.

 Press REPEAT button. Each time you press the REPEAT button, the repeat mode will change as following:

- Depending on your product, the repeat mode display maybe different.
- When you wish to stop the Repeat function, press REPEAT until "OFF" is displayed.
  - OFF : Cancels Repeat Playback.
  - TRACK : Repeatedly plays the selected track.
  - **DIR** : Repeatedly plays all tracks in the selected folder.
  - ALL : Repeatedly plays the all tracks in the disc.
  - **RANDOM** : Plays tracks in random order.

### Searching for a Specific Music Passage on a CD

When listening to a compact disc, you can quickly search for a specific music passage on a track.

To search for Press

- Forwards ..... >> button
- Backwards ..... < button
- ➢ Press and hold the I◀/➡I button on the top panel to automatically scan for a track.

### 10 Skip Track

Press the +10 button while in playback mode. This will skip the tracks as many as 10 from the current track.

### **CD** Programming

### (This function is not available during playback of an MP3/WMA-CD.)

- You can program the playback order of up to 24 tracks of your choice.
- However, you must stop playing the CD before selecting tracks.
- While in CD playback mode, press STOP(■) to stop playing the CD.
- Press the ENTER button to display the message below:

   III P□/ (01= program number, --= track number)
- 3. Use I or ▶ I to move to a desired track.
  - Press I to move to the previous track.
  - Press ▶ to move to the next track.
- Press the ENTER button to confirm your selection, the selection is stored and ■ P□2 -displayed.
- 5. To select a different track, following the steps 3 to 4 above.
- 6. Press PLAY (►II) to play the programmed tracks.
- Press STOP (■) to stop playing the programmed tracks, Press STOP (■) again to cancel playing the programmed tracks.
  - If you open the disc tray ,change the function or turn off the product, your programming will be canceled.

# Check and Edit the Programmed Tracks

You can check a list of programmed tracks and edit them as you want.

- If a programmed track is being played, press STOP (■) once.
- Press ENTER twice to display the message below: ■ □ | □ |

(C=Check, 01= program number)

- If a total of 24 tracks are already programmed, "C" will be displayed rather than "P" in the display.
- 3. Repeat pressing ENTER until the desired track is displayed.
- 4. Press I or ► to select a different track.
- 5. Press ENTER to confirm your selection.
- 6. To play the programmed tracks, press PLAY (►II).

### **Playing USB**

Connect an external storage device such as USB flash memory or external HDD (Hard Disk Drive) to the product. You can play files in MP3/WMA format.

### Before you begin!

- Connect the external USB storage device to your product.
- Press F() to select the USB mode.
- The first track of the first directory plays automatically.
- Press STOP (■) to stop playing.
- ≻Remove the USB storage

Press **STOP** (**■**) again to remove the USB

storage safely.

Do not connect a USB recharger to the USB port of this product. Otherwise, the product may be damaged.

### Selecting a Track from USB Device

#### You can select an MP3 file during the play.

- > If you want to move the next/previous(track), press the I◀,➡I buttons shortly.
  - It moves the next/previous file within the directory.
  - If you press the I₄, → I buttons more times than the number of the files in the directory, it will move over to the next directory.

### Searching a Folder Quickly

- 1. Press the TUNING/ALBUM ∧ or ∨ button on the remote control to move to the previous/next folder.
- 2. When the searching is done, you will see the next/ previous folder name. The track will start playing.

### To Use High Speed Search

You can search the desired section quickly during the play.

- > Press the ◀ , ➡ button.
  - Each time you press the button, you will move forward/backward fast.

The sound will not output in fast playback mode.

### To repeat

1. Press the **REPEAT** button.

Each time you press the **REPEAT** button, the

repeat mode will change as following:  $OFF \rightarrow TRACK \rightarrow DIR \rightarrow ALL \rightarrow RANDOM$ 

- 2. When you wish to stop the Repeat function, press the REPEAT button until OFF is displayed.
  - OFF: Cancels Repeat Playback.
  - **TRACK**: Repeatedly plays the selected track.
  - DIR: Repeatedly plays all tracks in the selected folder.
  - ALL: Repeatedly plays all tracks.
  - RANDOM: Plays tracks in random order.

### 10 Skip Track

## Read through the instructions below before using the USB storage.

- Some external USB storage device may not be compatible with this product.
- With external HDD, FAT format can be played.
- With USB 2.0 HDD, connect to a separate power source.

If it's not connected to a separate power source, it may not work.

- If memory of an external USB storage device is segmented into several parts, MP3 files of only the first hard disk drive can be played.
- DRM applied files are not played. Digital Rights Management: Technology and service that protect the profit and rights of copyright owners by disallowing unauthorized use of digital contents.
- Even if the file name ends with .mp3, the file does not play if actual file format is MPEG layer 1 or 2.
- Do not use a USB hub as it will not be recognized.
- Up to 15 letters of MP3/WMA file name will be shown.
- Removable HDDs equipped with less than 160 Gbytes are supported. Removable HDDs equipped with 160Gbytes or more may not be recognized, depending on the device.
- When selecting USB function, file reading (READ-IN) may take several minutes.
- When playing a USB device, there may be a delay then advancing to the next track, especially with HDD. The operation time of external USB storage devices will vary; even when they are of the same capacity.
- If the external USB storage device supports only USB VER1.1 and the access speed is slow,the file may not property.
- The product will automatically turn off from no USB and Stop mode for more than 25 minutes.

### Listening to Radio

You can store up to:15 FM stations.

#### 1. Press FUNCTION to select FM mode.

	To search for a station	Press TUNING MODE button
2.	Preset	 Once or more times until " <b>PRESET</b> " is displayed. You can search the stored
	Manually	 frequencies in the Preset mode. Once or more times until "MANUAL" is displayed. You can search the frequencies one by one in the manual mode.

3. Select the station in any of the following ways:

Press the TUNING/ALBUM  $\wedge$  or  $~\vee$  button on the remote control.

To fast scan for a frequency manually, press and hold the TUNING/ALBUM  $\wedge$  or  $~\forall$  button.

- 4. Press MO/ST to switch between stereo and mono.
  - In a poor reception area, select **MONO** for a clear, interference-free broadcast.
  - This applies only when listening to an FM station.
- If you don't want the preset, move back to step 3 and select a different preset.
   Otherwise.
  - a. Press ENTER.
  - b. Or, press the I≪, ►►I button on the top panel or TUNING/ALBUM ∧ or ∨ button on the remote control to select a program number.
  - c. Press ENTER to save the preset.
- 6. To save other radio frequency, repeat steps 2 through 5 above.

### ≻In Tuner Mode

- To scan for radio frequencies in manual mode, use the I≪, → I buttons on the top panel.
- To stop scanning, press STOP (■).
- To scan for a preset in preset tuning mode, use the I≪, → I buttons on the top panel.

### Selecting a Stored Station

You can listen to a stored radio station as follows:

- 1. Press FUNCTION to select FM mode.
- 2. Press the **TUNING MODE** button on the remote control until " **PRESET**" is displayed.
- Press I◄, → button on the top panel or TUNING/ALBUM ∧, ∨ on the remote control to select a desired preset number.

### About RDS broadcasting(Optional)

## Using the RDS (Radio Data System) to receive FM stations

RDS allows FM stations to send an additional signal along with their regular program signals. For example, the stations send their station names, as well as information about what type of program they broadcast, such as sports or music, etc. When tuned to an FM station which provides the RDS service, the RDS indicator lights up on the display.

### Description on RDS function

- **PTY** (Program Type) : Displays the type of programme currently being broadcast.
- **PS NAME** (Program Service Name) : Indicates the name of broadcasting station and is composed of 8 characters.
- **RT** (Radio Text) : Decodes the text broadcast by a station (if any) and is composed of maximum 64 characters.
- CT (Clock Time) : Decodes the real time clock from the FM frequency. Some stations may not transmit PTY, RT or CT information therefore this may not be displayed in all cases.
- TA (Traffic Announcement) : When this symbol flashes it shows that the traffic announcement is in progress. RDS may not operate correctly if the station tuned is not transmitting RDS signal properly or if the signal strength is weak.

### About RDS DISPLAY function(Optional)

You can see the RDS signals the station sends on the display.

Press the **RDS DISPLAY** button while listening to an FM station.

Each time you press the button, the display change to show you the following information : PS NAME ; RT; CT ; Frequency

PS (Program Service)	While searching, <ps> appears and then the station names will be displayed. <no ps=""> appears if no signal is sent.</no></ps>		
RT(RadioText)	While searching, <rt> appears and then text messages the station sends will be displayed. <no rt=""> appears if no signal is sent.</no></rt>		
CT (Clock Time)	Decodes the real time clock from the FM frequency. Some stations may not transmit PTY, RT or CT information therefore this may not be displayed in all cases.		
Frequency Station frequency (non-RE service)			

### About characters shown in the display

When the display shows PS,or RT signals,the following characters are used.

 ➤The display window cannot differentiate upper case and lower case letters and always uses upper case letters.

The display window cannot show accented letters, <A,> for instance, may stands for accented <A's> like  $<\dot{A}, \ddot{A}, \ddot{A}, \dot{A}$  and  $\tilde{A}.>$ 

### PTY(Program Type) indication and PTY-SEARCH function(Optional)

One of the advantages of the RDS service is that you can locate a particular kind of program from the preset channels by specifying the PTY codes.

### To search for a program using the PTY codes

#### Before you start!

- The PTY Search is only applicable to preset stations.
- To stop searching any time during the process, press the STOP button while searching.
- There is a time limit in doing the following steps. If the setting is cancelled before you finish, start from step 1 again.

- When pressing the buttons on the primary remote control, make sure that you have selected the FM station using the primary remote control.
- 1. Press the **RDS PTY** button while listening to an FM station.
- Press the TUNING/ALBUM ∧or ∨ buttons until the PTY code you want appears on the display.
  - The display gives you the PTY codes described to the right.
- Press the **RDS PTY** button again, while the PTY code selected in the previous step is still on the display.
  - The centre unit searches 30 preset FM stations, stops when it finds the one you have selected, and tunes in that station.

### Setting the Clock

For each step, you have a few seconds to set the required options. If you exceed this time, you must start again.

- 1. Switch the system on by pressing the **POWER** button.
- Press TIMER/CLOCK button and then press the ENTER button, "CLOCK" is displayed.
- 3. Press ENTER, the hour flashes.
  - Increase the hours: A.
  - Decrease the hours: V.
- When the correct hour is displayed, press ENTER, the minutes flashes.
  - Increase the minutes: A,
  - Decrease the minutes: V.
- 5. When the correct minute is displayed, press ENTER," ☐ TIME" appears in the display.
- ➤• The current time is set now.
  - You can display the time, even when you are using another function, by pressing the TIMER/CLOCK button once.
  - You can also use I ← or ► on the top panel instead of TUNING/ALBUM ∧ or ∨ buttons in step 3,4.

### **Timer Function**

- The timer enables you to switch the system on or off at specific times automatically.
  - Before setting the timer, check that the current time is correct.
  - For each step, you have a few seconds to set the required options. If you exceed this time, you must start again.
  - If you no longer want the system to be switched on or off automatically, you must cancel the timer by pressing TIMER ON/OFF button.

Example: You wish to wake up to music every morning.

- 1. Switch the system on by pressing the **POWER** button.
- 2. Press TIMER/CLOCK button thrice until TIME is displayed.
- Press the ENTER ( ( ) button, ON is displayed for a few seconds,you can set the timer switch-on time.
- 4. Set the timer switch-on time.
  - a Press the TUNING/ALBUM  $\wedge \text{or} \lor$  buttons.
  - b Press the ENTER ( ) button, the minutes flash.
  - c Press the **TUNING/ALBUM**  $\Lambda$ ,or  $\vee$  buttons.
  - d Press the ENTER ( ) button.
     OFF is displayed for a few seconds, you can now set the timer switch-off time.
- 5. Set the timer switch-off time.
  - a Press the TUNING/ALBUM  $\Lambda$ , or  $\vee$  buttons.
  - b Press the ENTER ( ) button, the minutes flash.
  - c Press the **TUNING/ALBUM**  $\Lambda$ ,or  $\vee$  buttons.
  - d Press the ENTER ( ) button, VOL XX is displayed, where XX corresponds to the volume already set.
- Press TUNING/ALBUM ∧,or ∨ buttons to adjust the volume level and press the ENTER ( → ) button,the source to be selected is displayed.
- Press the TUNING/ALBUM A,or V buttons to select the source to be played when the system switches on.
  - FM (radio) : a Press the ENTER( (⊂) )button.
     b Select a preset station by press the TUNING/ALBUM ∧,or ∨ button.

CD/MP3 (compact disc) ......Load one compact disc. USB.....Connect the USB device.

8. Press the ENTER ( 🖼 ) button,CHK REC (Do

you want to record?) is displayed.

- - If you select the REC N, it will cancel tuner timing recording even if you have already set the tuner timing recording.
  - If you select the REC Y, you can set the tuner timing recording. a. Press the ENTER ( ים) button,
    - **ON** is displayed for a few seconds, you can set the tuner timing recording switch-on time.
    - b. Press the ENTER ( ) button, OFF is displayed for a few seconds, you can set the tuner timing recording switch-off time.
- The maximal tuner timing recording time is 5 hours.
  - If the timer switch on and off times are identical, the word ERROR is displayed.
  - If the switch-on or -off time is the same as the timing recording time, only the switch-on or -off time is effective, and the timing recording time is not applied.
  - If the auto timer is turned on the MP3/CD or USB function may require an additional step to be activated depending on the disc(or device). So it is better for you to select the tuner function instead.
  - If there is no disc or usb, when you select the "CD, USB, it will automatically change to "FM".
  - You may use the ►, I ← buttons on the main unit instead of the **TUNING/ALBUM** ∧ or V button to adjust in Steps 4 through 9.

### Cancelling the Timer

After having set the timer, it will start automatically as shown by the TIMER indication on the display. If you no longer wish to use the timer, you can cancel it.

- To cancel the timer, press TIMER ON/OFF once, is no longer displayed.

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### **Record Function**

You can record the audio of a CD/Radio or external music player to a USB storage device.

- 2. Play CD/Radio to record, or connect the external device to the main unit.

- CD

- Press F() on the top panel to select MP3/CD.
- Press OPEN/CLOSE button to open the disc tray.
- Insert a CD and press **OPEN/CLOSE** button to close the disc tray.
- Press I or ▶ to play a desired music.

- FM Tuner

- Use the F() button to select FM mode.
- Select a radio frequency to record.

#### - External Device

- Connect the external device (MP3 player) to the product.
- Press F() button to select AUX mode.
- Play the music file in the external device.
- 3. Press the USB REC button to start recording.

- CD

- "TRACK RECORDING" is displayed and CD recording starts.
- Press and hold the USB REC button to start recording the all tracks of Disc.
  - "FULL CD RECORDING" is displayed.
  - MP3-CD
- Press the **USB REC** button. The currently playing file is copied onto the USB device.
- Press and hold the USB REC button. All the files of the current folder are copied onto the USB device.
- If you record the MP3, the file is copied into the USB device totally. "CHECK"→"START" → "COPY XX"→"COPY END" is displayed. When the recording is done, "STOP" will be displayed.
- If there is the same file name, "CHECK"→"FILE EXIST" → "STOP" is displayed, and the function is

canceled.

- FM /External Source
- "SAM-XXXX.MP3 RECORD" is displayed.
- Press STOP (■) to stop playing. Then, a mp3 file will be created accordingly.
  - After the recording, a directory named RECORDING(DISCXXXX)"(FULL CD RECORDING)", "RECORDING"(TRACK RE-CORDING), "CD COPY"(MP3 CD), "TUNER RECORDING" or "AUX RECORDING" will be created in your device.

- Do not disconnect the USB or the AC Cord during the recording as this may cause file damage.
  - If you disconnect the USB device during a recording, the unfinished recording file may get damaged and cannot be deleted. If this occurs, please connect the USB device to a PC and backup the data stored in the USB first, and then format it.
  - When the USB memory is not enough, it will be displayed "NOT ENOUGH MEMORY".
  - The recording works if the USB device or the HDD is formatted in the FAT file system.(The NTFS file system is not supported.)
  - When you use CD high speed search function, the CD recording can't work.
  - Sometimes, the recording time may be longer with some USB devices.
  - In the program mode, you can't use the CD recording function.
  - When the CD recording, the EQ can not work and automatically change to OFF.
  - When the CD recording, the REPEAT function can not work and automatically changes to OFF.
  - You can not record the radio when searching or no available frequencies in the Tuner mode.
  - Note that setting the input level too loud when recording music from an external device through the AUX and USB channel may introduce noise into the recording. In that case, lower the external device's volume level.
  - No sound is heard during CD recording.
  - The maximum TUNER/AUX recording time is 5 hours.
  - The speed of recording audio CD into USB storage is fixed to 4x.

### EQ Mode

The micro component system supports the predefined equalizer settings between high and low frequencies to be in harmonious with the current music genre.

Press **EQ** on the remote control.

Each time you press EQ, the EQ model will switch in the following order:

#### OFF →FLAT→RANCHERA → SAMBA → CUMBIA → HABANERA→ BOOMBA→REGGAE → PARTY → POP → HIPHOP→ ROCK→JAZZ → CLASSIC →MP3 ENHANCER → VIRTUAL SOUND→POWER BASS.

- The EQ button will be disabled during the recording, and the product switches to " OFF" automatically.
  - Some regional EQs are special, such as India, Africa, and so on. Please refer to the display of actual product to operate.
