

Power sources



Connect the AC power cord A or insert six R14 (size C) batteries (not supplied) into the battery compartment B.

- Replace the batteries when the OPR/BATT indicator 11 dims or when the unit stops operating. Replace all the batteries with new ones. Before you replace the batteries, be sure to take out the CD from the unit.
- To use the unit on batteries, disconnect the AC power cord from the unit.



On operation

- hour for the moisture to evaporate. If the unit has not been used for a long time, set it in the playback mode to warm it up for a few minutes before inserting a cassette

 Break off the cassette tab from side A or B to prevent accidental recording. If you want to reuse the tape for recording, cover the broken tab with adhesive tape.





Before using the unit

To turn on/off the power

European model: Press OPERATE 1.

Other models: Press POWER 1.

When turning on the power, hold down OPERATE (or POWER) $\boxed{\mathbf{1}}$

until OPR/BATT indicator 11 lights up.

To adjust the volume Press VOLUME +, - 8.

To listen through headphones

Connect the headphones to the Ω (headphones) jack 6 on the back of the unit.

To reinforce the bass sound

Press MEGA BASS 7.

"MEGA BASS" appears in the display.

To return to normal sound, press the button again.


Playing a CD

- 1 Press OPERATE (or POWER) 1.
- 2 Press CD 4.
- 3 Press ♠ PUSH OPEN/CLOSE 5 and place a disc with the label side up on the CD compartment. To close the CD compartment, press ♠ PUSH OPEN/CLOSE 5

The unit plays all the tracks once.

Listening to the radio

- 1 Press OPERATE (or POWER) 1
- 2 Press RADIO BAND 4 repeatedly. Each time you press the button, the radio band toggles between AM and FM.
- 3 Hold down TUNE + or 13 until the frequency digits begin to change in the display.

The unit automatically scans the radio frequencies and stops when it finds a clear station.

If you cannot tune in a station, press TUNE + or – 13 repeatedly to change the frequency step by step. When an FM stereo broadcast is received, "St"

If an FM broadcast is noisy, changing the current status to monaural usually reduces the noise 1 Press MODE 15.

- 2 While "St" is displayed, press MODE 15 to display "Mo."

Playing a tape

- 1 Press OPERATE (or POWER) 1.
- 2 Press TAPE 4.
- 3 Press 2, and insert the tape into the tape compartment with the side you want to play facing upward. Use TYPE I (normal) tape only. To close the tape compartment, press CLOSE 3

Make sure there is no slack in the tape to avoid damaging the tape or the unit.

Using the display

To check the total track number and playing time of the CD

Press ■ 10 once if the CD is stopped and twice if the CD is playing. After the total track number is displayed, the total playing time is displayed. To check the total track number again, press DISPLAY/ENTER 14.

To check the current track number of the CD Press DISPLAY/ENTER 14 while playing a CD.

To check the current preset station number of the radio

Press DISPLAY/ENTER 14 when you are listening to a preset station.

Selecting a CD play mode

Press MODE 15 (press ■ 10, then press MODE 15 during playback) until "← 1", "←", "SHUF", "SHUF" and "rightarrow", "PGM", or "PGM" and "rightarrow" appear in the display. Then proceed as follows:

To cancel the selected play mode

Press MODE 15 (press ■ 10, then press MODE 15 during playback) repeatedly until the selected mode disappears from the display.

To check the programed track and playing order in the display

To check the order of tracks before playing, press DISPLAY/ENTER 14 (press ■ 10, then press DISPLAY/ ENTER 14 during playback).

Every time you press the button, the track number appears in the programed order.

To change the current program

Press ■ 10 once if the CD is stopped and twice if the CD is playing. The current program will be erased. Then create a new program following the programming procedure.

- · If you try to program 21 tracks or more, "FULL" will appear in the display.
- You can play the same program again, since the program is saved until you open the CD compartment.
- You can record your own program. After you have created the program, insert a blank tape and press • 2 to start recording.
- The resume function does not work during shuffle play or
- program play.

Presetting radio stations

You can store radio stations into the unit's memory. You can preset up to 30 radio stations, 20 for FM and 10 for AM in any order.

- 1 Press OPERATE (or POWER) 1
- **2** Press RADIO BAND **4** to select the band.
- 3 Hold down AUTO PRESET 4 for 2 seconds until "Auto" flashes in the display.
- 4 Press DISPLAY/ENTER 14.

The stations are stored in memory from the lower frequencies to the higher ones.

If a station cannot be preset automatically

You need to preset a station with a weak signal manually.

1 Press OPERATE (or POWER) **1**.

6 Press DISPLAY/ENTER 14.

- 2 Press RADIO BAND 4 to select the band.
- **3** Tune in a station you want using TUNE + or 13. 4 Hold down MEMORY 14 for 2 seconds until the preset number flashes in the display.
- **5** Press PRESET + or 9 until the preset number you
- want for the station flashes in the display.
- The new station replaces the old one.

The preset radio stations remain in memory even if you unplug the AC power cord or remove the batteries.

Playing preset radio stations

- 1 Press OPERATE (or POWER) 1
- 2 Press RADIO BAND 4 to select the band.
- **3** Press PRESET + or 9 to tune in the stored station.

Connecting optional components

You can enjoy the sound from an optional component such as a portable digital music player through the speakers of this unit. Be sure to turn off the power of each component before making any connections. For details, refer to the instruction manual of the component to be connected.

- 1 Connect the AUDIO IN jack 12 to the line output jack of the portable digital music player or other components using an audio connecting cable (not supplied).
- 2 Press OPERATE (or POWER) 1 to turn the unit on.
- 3 Turn the connected component on.
- 4 Press AUDIO IN 4 and start playback on the connected component.

The sound from the connected component is output from the speakers of this unit.

To connect the unit to a TV or VCR, use an extension cable (not supplied) with a stereo-mini jack on one end and two phono plugs on the other end.

You can record the sound of the connected component. Insert a blank tape and press ● 2.

Troubleshooting

General

The power is not on.

- Connect the AC power cord to the wall outlet securely.
- Make sure the batteries are inserted correctly.
- Replace all the batteries with new ones if they are weak.

There is no audio. Unplug the headphones when listening through speakers.

Noise is heard.

Someone is using a portable telephone or other equipment that emits radio waves near the unit.

→ Move the portable telephone, etc., away from the unit.

- The CD does not play or "Cd -" is displayed even when a CD is in place.
- Place the CD with the label surface up. Clean the CD.

CD player

- Take out the CD and leave the CD compartment open for about an hour to dry moisture condensation.
- The CD-R/CD-RW is blank. There is a problem with the quality of the CD-R/CD-RW, recording
- device or application software
- · Replace all the batteries with new ones if they are weak. The sound drops out.
- Reduce the volume Clean the CD, or replace it if the CD is badly damaged.

Poor or distorted playback, recording or erasing quality.

- Clean the heads by using dry- or wet-type cleaning cassette (available separately) after every 10 hours of use, before you start an important recording, or after playing an old tape. Failure to clean the tape heads can cause degraded sound quality or an inability of the unit to record or play tapes. For details, refer to the instructions of the cleaning cassette.
- The TYPE II (high position) or TYPE IV (metal) tape is being used. Use TYPE I (normal) tape only.
- Demagnetize the heads using a commercially available tape head
- Replace all the batteries with new ones if they are weak.
- After trying the remedies, if you still have problems, unplug the AC power cord or remove all the batteries. After all the indications in the display disappear, plug the AC power cord or insert the batteries again. If the problem persists, please consult your nearest Sony
